## **Course Content in Detail**

- The Essentials: welcoming patients, describing your role and responsibilities; staff in the hospital, medical terminology, everyday healthcare language, hospital equipment, clothing, PPE.
- Describing conditions of the body: from head to toe, back to front, inside and out.
- Care in Action: doing observations; types
  of pain; pressure ulcers; falls and injuries;
  sprains, strains, fractures and dislocations;
  infections, HCAIs; respiratory difficulties,
  asthma, upper respiratory tract infections;
  post-operative care and discharge
- Administering Medications: pain medication, IV fluids, antibiotics; drug calculations – dose, frequency, allergies; treating the elderly; eye drops and eye ointment; side effects.

- Interacting with Colleagues: giving a handover, writing an incident report, talking about clinical pathways, phone calls, using SBAR to communicate with colleagues
- Hospital Charts: admission form, pain scales, Waterlow pressure area assessment tool, falls risk assessment, wound care chart, burns chart, VIP scores, fluid balance chart, drug charts, oxygen prescription, district nurse referral
- IELTS Familiarisation: the 4 IELTS Papers Reading, Listening, Writing, Speaking; exam formats; task and question types; levels of difficulty, scoring system.
- **IELTS Techniques**: what is academic English; what the examiner wants; how to approach different skills papers; key exam strategies.

**Inputs:** during the course, learners watch videos, listen to conversations, read relevant texts, analyse charts and graphs, look at photographs and images, work on IELTS test formats and techniques, and study vocabulary, grammar and pronunciation focus points.

**Exercises:** learners take a wide range of exercises. The exercises concentrate either on scenarios using English at work or on the 4 IELTS papers: Reading, Writing, Listening and Speaking.

**Length:** 100 hours of Nursing English plus 40 hours of IELTS test preparation.

**Progress Assessment:** at the end of every unit, there is a progress review and test so participants can assess what they have learnt.

**End of Course Achievement Certificate:** delivered electronically on course completion. 80 CPD Points.
